Behavior Expectations

CTE recognizes and supports the right of every individual to feel respected and physically and emotionally safe.

At CTE, modeling and teaching appropriate individual and group behavior is embedded throughout the curriculum and performance process. Staff and interns are trained to promote positive interactions, to be proactive in preventing problem behaviors, and to respond constructively to inappropriate behaviors. Every CTE student is required to respect the rights of others to learn and grow, and to respect the CTE staff, space and facilities.

If a student exhibits repeated inappropriate and disruptive behavior, every effort will be made to redirect the student with reminders of appropriate and expected behavior. Should the student continue to exhibit inappropriate and disruptive behavior, CTE staff will implement the following progressive steps:

1. Removal from activity until staff makes parent contact.
2. Should inappropriate behavior continue or escalate, staff will hold a conference with student and a parent or guardian to create a mutually agreed upon behavior contract.
3. Failure to follow the behavior contract may result in CTE removing a student from the program for the remainder of the summer.

In the event of an incident of student behavior that threatens the physical or emotional well-being of students or staff, CTE reserves the right to unilaterally remove a student from the program.
